To prepare for this test, someone wanting to become a citizen has to learn and know the answers to 100 such questions (if you are over 50, you only have to retain half that knowledge). However, in the test, you will only answer 10 randomly selected ones questions – but you do not know which 10! We would love to have help from volunteers and not just for the refreshment portion of the program.
